




We are a "5 for 5" congregation—supporting all five of the UCC denomination-wide offerings:





Our facilities are in use daily by ABLE (Adult Basic Literacy Education), two AA groups, Help Me Grow parents' and toddlers' playgroup, Children's Services parenting classes, our own Nursery School, and others. Our members reach out into the community through the CROP walk, Relay for Life, Friendship Meals, Salvation Army Back to School and Holiday projects, and People to People food programs. We lead services once a month at Brenn-Field, and we are joining other Wayne County UCC and Disciples churches to build a Habitat House in Apple Creek this fall.







Knowing we'll be faced with rising energy costs in the next year, we remain determined to continue our ministries. As a congregation, we hope to say, Come in! You are welcome here!


