
Our Overall Mission

The overall mission of our church is determined by the support of our members, associate members and friends. We currently have 162 members, 25 associate members, and 123 individuals who have not


become members, but regularly attend services and who we call friends of our church. We call on members, associate members and friends to support the mission of their church.

We estimate that the cost of accomplishing God's mission for our Church family and our Community for the year 2007 will be \$201,500. Our expenses include salaries, occupancy costs, debt service, insurance and many other costs which are necessary to do God's work through our missions. However, these costs are more meaningful when viewed as to their purpose or mission Therefore, we allocated those costs not directly identified with a mission of the church. (such as electricity) to our missions based on the per cent of the Pastor's time spent on each activity.

The following pages will describe in detail how your generosity will serve the needs of our church family and outreach to others in need.








Supporting the \$12,848 Wider Church 6%

Our mission extends far beyond our church family and our local community. In 2007, we will continue to support the Christian work carried on by the Conference and the national agencies of the United Church of Christ, through which we provide services to the congregations in our vicinity and minister to many people in our state, nation, and other countries. The Ministries Department supports programs not only in our community, but throughout the world. In 1977, we will support One Great Hour of Sharing, Strength the Church, Neighbors in Need and Veterans of the Cross. We will also have Blanket Sunday and Tool Sunday. We support the Church Women United with a representative from our congregation, participating and attending the monthly meetings. Through this group we are hoping to host World of Prayer this year.









Supporting Music \$80,992 And Worship 40%


Worship is central to our congregation's life and ministry. Planning for Sunday morning worship, researching for and preparing sermons and other special services, such as baptisms, weddings and funerals, all require a significant amount of our pastor's time.

Our worship life also includes:

- Purchasing and printing regular and large print bulletins
- Supplying flowers, candles and communion elements
- Providing ushers and lay readers
- Decorating the church for Advent season

Our music director consults with the pastor, reviews, selects, purchases, records music and plays at the 10:30 & 8:30 services. He selects music for the choir conducts rehearsals and records music for accompaniment and practice. He also sees to it that the pianos and organ are tuned regularly.

Our worship budget also must provide for the cost of guest ministers in absence of our pastor.



The completion of our new building allows us to expand our outreach to the children and adults of our community in areas of education, social interaction and sharing with those in need.

In 2006, Teens In Action put in over 800 hours of community service helping area families in need with clothing, food and gifts. They adopted a mile of beach; helped with-- worship services; fellowship functions; area food drives; babysitting; the UCC Art Camp; the Back to School Backpack program and hosted a Christmas party for the Domestic Abuse Shelter clients. In a week- long mission trip to south Florida, our teens helped with a construction project for a deaf center (roof, deck and a concrete walkway). In 2007, our Teens in Action will outreach with similar projects, specifically helping Gifts of Love, the Crop Walk and will continue helping the area's needy

The Ministries department supports our community every day through the Gifts of Love by the food we donate each month, which is given to families in need. The money donated goes to help with utilities, rent and medication. We also provide a hot meal once a month.







Inviting Others to \$25,336 Share Our Life \$13%

We spend money to advertise in the yellow pages and send articles to newspapers to let the community know of our presence and our programs. We are a member of the Chamber of Commerce. Pastor Sarah attends two functions each month to make the community more aware of who we are. We publish the Voice, a monthly newsletter, to inform our membership and others of our activities. We participate in the "Adopt a Road" project and pick up trash four times a year on two local roads. Our sign is prominently displayed on those roads.


We also:

Caring for our \$37,687 Church Family 19%

Pastoral care is a vital part of our work, especially for persons who are ill, hospitalized, bereaved, preparing for marriage, going through a divorce or facing other crises.

Our six Stephen Ministers and three leaders are trained Christian caregivers, who make confidential weekly visits to members or friends with emotional or physical problems. It maybe the loss of a loved one, a terminal illness, divorce, loneliness, job loss or a spiritual crises.

Our pastor checks on shut-ins, provides transportation as needed, counsels and consoles those who are suffering.

We purchase literature and other resources for people with special needs.

Our church secretary provides a friendly ear, as well as, a phone contact for shut-ins. She also coordinates all functions taking place in our buildings and prepares and provides information for monthly Church Council Meetings and for the Annual Meeting of Members.

Our monthly newsletter (the Voice), occasional letters, our directory, the bulletin inserts, weekly fellowship hour and other social events, including the annual picnic are all part of sustaining our common life.

We are currently holding weekly Sunday school classes, adult bible studies.

Teens In Action hold weekly meetings, which focus on fellowship, discussions and Bible studies and include occasional speakers from Church and from the community.
